Tech-Tip: Honk Your Horn!

Brief Summary of the June Tech-Talk on the Model A Horn

It's not hard to keep the voice of your Model A sounding loud and clear. The distinctive ah OOO' gah is generated by a small DC motor spinning a 'waffle' disk. The diaphram stud bounces against the waffle wheel. As the motor accellerates, the vibration resonates the 1^{st} part of the ah OOO'. On release of the horn button, the sudden stop of the wheel produces the 2^{nd} tone... GAH. An adjusting screw sets the tension on the diaphram.

MaintainceTips:

- 1) Oil the motor felts with a couple of drops of light weight oil of your preference a couple of times a season.
- 2) Good wiring connections are essential to delivering consistent power to the motor. The horn rod, can be the weak link in the circuit. A supplemental relay to ground can be helpful.
- 3) The varying voltage from the generator can make adjustment a little touchy. Tune it for the speed (rpms) you are going to drive; or when the engine is off and only on battery power.
- 4) The Model a horn is a truly unique sound... don't let your Model A admirers down.

"Designers used multiple hemlines to accustom the eye to longer skirts.... foreshadows the higher waist and feminine look that would spread to everyday fashion by the early 1930s. Evening dresses featured simple lines and emphasis at the hips. Hair is parted to one side and worn in soft waves. After many years of a "stovepipe" silhouette, "natural" curves were beginning to reappear. Knee-length, pleated skirts and dropped waists were still popular as everyday clothes in 1929, though Paris designers were already showing longer skirts and higher waistlines. Bridesmaids gowns of 1929 have knee-length underskirts and longer, sheer over skirts, foreshadowing the trend toward longer skirts."


The day ended with a drawing for a chrome-plated alternator and a 50/50 raffle. A great annual event; always held on the first Sunday in June.
