- Jim Morley spoke about Model A Days at Gilmore on September 15-16. Anyone wanting to attend should contact Jim for carpooling and hotel information.


UPCOMING TOURS - Big THANKS to Toni Lynn, Al, and Joe for these great tours!!

You never know where the "Curve in the Road" will take you. When Julia and I travel, whenever possible, like to take back roads when we travel to points of interest. We enjoy seeing the people, farms, houses, animals, farm machinery working the fields, and interesting countryside points of interest. Of course, Julia looks for crafts shows and fairs as I look for Ford Model A's cars and antique stores which might have some parts inside. While traveling to the Clauson Family Music Show in Coloma, WI last month Julia spotted a covered bridge as we drove along. We turned the car around to check out this covered bridge. As you approach the bridge you can hear the rushing water from the stream below as it passes under the bridge and flows downstream. You can see and feel the strength of the bridge by its large timbers which intertwine with each other. We have always been drawn to the beauty of a covered bridge. This one is called the "Springwater Volunteer Covered Bridge" located in the Town of Springwater, in Waushara County on 24th Lane off of Hwy. A, east of Wild Rose, Wisconsin. When the original bridge needed to be replaced, local residents got together to volunteer their skills, time and money in 1997 to design and build this covered bridge. Somehow the bridge received the phrase, "Covering the Future... With the Past". After viewing this covered bridge, one wonders how many other covered bridges are located within driving distance to perhaps get some more photo opportunities. Something worth looking into. 

Chicken Salad with Grapes and Cashews

This easy-to-make chicken salad is packed with grapes, cashews, and celery for lots of crunch

- 2 cups cooked and chopped chicken breast
- 3 stalks celery,
- finely chopped

2 cups green grapes, halved

³/₄ cup cashews, chopped

1¼ cup mayonnaise

- % teaspoon curry powder, optional
- 1 teaspoon salt

To serve: croissants, green leaf lettuce Place the chicken, celery, grapes, cashews, optional curry powder, and salt in a large bowl. Toss to combine. Stir in the mayonnaise.

Cut croissants in half lengthwise. Place a leaf of green leaf lettuce on the bottom of each croissant half and top with chicken salad. Place the remaining croissant half on top. Serve immediately.
