

FORD MODEL A ADVENTURES

Now you heard about potentially what parts are not available for your vehicle after it breaks down and wonder what your next options are. One potential resource could be going to a local car show. Especially if the car show specializes in your specific make, model, and year of the vehicle you own.

Recently, Madison Classics held their 46th Annual Spring Car Show at the Jefferson County fairgrounds. This show is always held the last full weekend in April of each year and the Fall car show is the last full weekend in September. Each year the show specializes in a particular vehicle make, model, and years manufactured. This year's featured vehicle was the Ford Mustang.

Along with viewing the featured vehicles, spectators can walk between rows and rows of vendors selling everything from tools to car parts. I found it best to ask, "do you have anything for a Ford Model A" or for whatever you are looking for.

This year's show, possibly because of the rain, limited vendors with Ford Model A parts. The vendors we found had full headlight assemblies, literature, tools, car body & door parts, jacks, engine, car parts and license plates. It never hurts to see if you can find the part you need to fix your vehicle.

When going to the Jefferson Show be sure to check out the event table located in the main food building. On this table are all the events for the surrounding area. Any of our color brochures left on Friday were gone already and the ones I put down Saturday were going fast. A Ford Model A in rough shape had a price tag of \$5,000 with no title. See photos.

Each time I go I realize how important it is to research and know your parts so you can be sure you are buying the correct part. Bringing a picture of the correct part you need will help a lot.

The Rockford Model T Ford Club is having a swap meet on Saturday, May 20th, 2023, starting at 6:00am at the Boone County Fairgrounds in Belvidere, Illinois. This show might have the great potential for Ford Model A parts.

Weather is sometimes an issue in late April, but you have to admit, its better than snow, black ice and salt. Let's do this again every spring... if not maybe again later this summer before any big Model A tours. My shop is almost always "open" if you ever need a "lift" or some simple help.

I just finished putting an engine together that had been apart for a couple years, with pieces scattered all over my shop. Long story short, it was a newly rebuilt engine that had developed a nasty knock after only a few hundred miles of running. After tearing the entire engine apart, I found that #2 piston was scuffed severely. It turned out that this particular piston, which was .080" oversize, was defective. I bought a new set of .080" pistons and put it all back together. The engine now runs well without any knocks, bangs, piston slap, rattles, etc. The


