





DID YOU KNOW?

Ford changes and models for each year

- 1930 ----- The Model A is given a new grille hood and cowl and the first use of Stainless steel bright work on Radiator shell
- 1931 ----- Despite Recession Ford opens new plants in Dagenham in England and Cologne in Germany
- 1932 ----- The new model B series is introduced and the new V8 powered Model 18 is shown for the first time
- 1933 ----- All Fords are completely redesigned on a longer chassis and Ford V8 Engine now is 75 HP
- 1934 ----- Enamel paint replaces hand-buffed lacquer on all fords
- 1935 ----- Ford restyles the Model 48 with longer, wider bodies and a narrower grille and 16-inch wheels
- 1936 ----- New steel disc wheels replace wire wheels for smoother ride
- 1937 ----- A Ford V8 wins the Monte Carlo Rally
- 1937 ----- Addition of 60 HP mini-V-8 engines for some '37 models...limited production + standard 85HP V-8. Short-lived.
- 1939 ----- All Fords adopt Hydraulic Brakes

1920's Tea Room Lemon Pound Cake

This is the kind of recipe that keeps getting handed down. It's THAT GOOD and perfectly classic. Oh, yum!

3 C. all-purpose flour

1 T. baking powder

¾ tsp. salt

3 C. sugar

1 C. unsalted butter, room temp

½ cup shortening, room temp

5 large eggs

1 C. whole milk

6 T. lemon juice and 1 lemon, zested

Preheat oven to 350°. Spray or butter and flour 2 loaf pans or one large Bundt pan. Sift flour, baking powder and salt into medium bowl. Set aside. Using an electric mixer, cream together butter, shortening and sugar. Add eggs one at a time, beating until well blended after each one. Add dry ingredients in three additions to butter mixture alternately with milk, beginning and ending with flour mixture. Beat at low speed just until blended after each addition. Mix in lemon juice & zest. Pour batter into prepared pans. Bake cakes until tested inserted into center comes out clean, about 55 minutes. Cook cakes in pans for 15 minutes. Turn cakes out onto racks & cool completely. ~ Dallas A's newsletter *Quail Tale*






