Recently, I heard someone ask the question, does the radiator need to be removed when changing a four blade to a two blade aluminum?

One person suggested the radiator needed to be removed, another person said they cut two of the four blades off, removed hood and supports and upper radiator hose.

Tilt radiator forward and removed water pump with the remaining blade horizontal.

Replaced fan, then reinstalled the water pump. Looks like there are many tips to completing this task. What is your tip?

Excellent tip was to put a piece of cardboard or a thin piece of plywood between the fan and the radiator to prevent damage.
