

As summer ends and fall begins there are still more outside events and car shows to attend.

On Friday, September 20th and Saturday, September 21st, 2024 the Gilmore Car Museum in Hickory Corners, MI is hosting their 11th annual Ford Model A Days from 9:00-4:00pm. Special events and activities such as swap meet, technical and fashion seminars and live music will be throughout the day.

One upcoming event is the 41st Hill and Valley Antique Auto and Americana Show which will be held Sunday, September 21st, 2024 at Baer Park in Cross Plains, WI.

This event begins with a viewing the one hour tour through their hills and valleys departing at 10am. Afterwards you can enjoy the many antique and classic cars, trucks, tractors, gas engines and horse-drawn vehicles. Between 7:00-10:00am there is a pancake breakfast, with concessions following at 10:30-2:00pm. Arts and crafts show, Early Americana demonstrations and Ford Model T assembly will be available throughout the day.

Another favorite car show by Madison Classics will be the Fall Jefferson Car Show at the Jefferson Fairgrounds on Friday, September 27th, 2024 from 8:00am to 4:00pm and Saturday, September 28th, 2024 from 6:00am to 4:00pm. Admission is \$15:00 per person which includes parking.

EASY PECAN PUMPKIN PIE

3 large eggs, 1 C. sugar, 1/2 C. dark corn syrup, 1 C. LIBBY's Solid Pack Pumpkin (not filling), 1 T. vanilla, 1 C. pecan halves, 1 unbaked 9" pie crust Combine eggs, sugar, corn syrup, pumpkin and vanilla in medium bowl. Gently stir in pecans. Pour into crust & bake @375° for 55-60 minutes or until knife inserted in center comes out clean. Serve with whipped cream or whipped topping. Serves 8

The below picture was captured by members of the Salt Creek Model A Club in Aurora, IL who drove their A's to Franklin Grove, IL. Their plan was to try and snap a picture of the A's with the vintage Union Pacific Big Boy locomotive. This locomotive, #4014, is a steam engine built in 1941. It operated until, 1961, having travelled over 1 million miles. Its restoration was completed in 2019, and it now does occasional trips around the country with this year's Heartland of America Tour covering 8 states. In the picture, the engine was roaring by at about 50 MPH.



THE FORD CONNECTION TO TRAINS As Paul Harvey would say, "and now the rest of the story..."

In the early 1860s, George Pullman had made a good living as a building mover, first along the Erie Canal and later along the Chicago River as the city of Chicago was rapidly growing. While on a long train trip, he had a very uncomfortable experience and decided there had to be a better way to travel on trains, especially overnight. With that inspiration, he started the Pullman Palace Car Company to make luxury sleeper cars for trains. He located his new company on land south of the Chicago stockyards, near Lake Calumet.

He built a progressive sprawling factory with multiple buildings, a sequential assembly line and suppliers on site. George Pullman also had a benevolent streak and build a company town next to the factory that included deluxe homes (with running water), a hotel, a church shared by multiple denominations, a company store, rental apartments for visitors, and a community center. Like Henry Ford's experimental social programs, Pullman's company town also had challenges. Great stories if you want to know more.

So the Henry Ford connection. By 1920, Henry Ford had become famous and was recognized whenever he travelled. He decided to order his own Pullman car. It was 82' long and cost \$159,000. Henry named it Fair Lane, like is home in Dearborn, and like the area in Ireland where his grandfather lived. For the price of 25 regular fares, a train would hook onto the Pullman car and take it to the destination where the regular folks were headed. It was quite a magnificent way to travel. Henry and his family used it for business trips and vacations

Imagine Clara Ford travelling in style on an overnight trip to New York for shopping. Imagine Henry travelling in the Pullman on a business trip to Michigan's upper peninsula or to his new factory in south Chicago. Most of their trips would have started and ended at Michigan Central Station in Detroit. They certainly would have seen a lot of Model As on their trips in the 1930s.

Now: The Pullman company went out of business in the 1980s. The empty factory buildings and the company town buildings fell into disrepair over the years, but the area was proclaimed a National Historic Site in 2017, with lots of restoration and preservation completed and more in process. It's a wonderful place to tour if you find yourself in Chicago.

Henry's Fair Lane Pullman car was sold in 1942 as Henry and Clara travelled less. The car was sold a couple of times, eventually restored to early grandeur, then donated to the Henry Ford Museum. Check out photos and more of the story on the **TheHenryFord.org** web site. Lastly, that Detroit Michigan Central Station was also unused and had fallen into significant disrepair. Thanks to Ford, that train station was saved from the wrecking ball and restored. This year it reopens and is providing offices for tech companies, as well as Ford employees. It's a nice cornerstone to rebuilding a modern Detroit.
