Gloves in Gettysburg: Gloves from the Model A Ford Era

## Gloves in Gettysburg

During the Model A Era, a woman did not leave home without her gloves. She wore gloves for both casual daytime events and formal affairs. A wide variety of gloves were shown in catalogs & magazines of this era and the one distinctive feature of all gloves is the stitching of 3 points on the back of the glove. More casual gloves tend to be a slip-on style, and dressier gloves are referred to as Mousquetaire gloves which have a one or two button opening at the wrist to have a snug fit. (In opera gloves, the purpose of the opening was to allow the wearer to slip her hand out of the glove without removing the entire glove.) Years ago, gentlemen would wear gloves for almost every occasion, such as riding or walking in public, or going to the theater or church. Day gloves (or 'street gloves') were worn as gentlemen went about their daily lives, whether visiting their club, meeting their tailor, or conducting important business affairs. Men's formal evening gloves were worn when invited to parties, be a host and entertain at home, or go out to the theater.
