

Ed McCollough, 5 years old at the time, was on his way to Tunnel City, Wisc. with his dad, Earl, to take some grain into town, plus he had a nickel in his hand to buy his mom, Esther, a birthday present as the next day was her birthday. His dad knew the brakes were terrible on their car and he saw the train coming but it coasted unto the tracks instead of stopping. Ed said he remembered every car of that train hitting them as they were stuck against a railroad switch post. When the train stopped, he said the porters all came running back to the car with blankets in their arms, thinking they were going to find a mess of bodies. Luckily neither of them was hurt very badly, bruises and abrasions only. They were taken out of the car through the roof, not thrown as the newspaper articles stated. Esther told her son that he still had the nickel in his hand for her present when they returned home from the doctor. It's a scenario that Ed remembers pretty clear to this very day. God was watching over them!! Ed also remembers that he had a 5-gallon gas can between his legs when the car got hit. YIKES!

# Tech-Tip: Facts

In the late 1920s and early 1930s, the Ford Model A was one of the most publicized and best-selling cars in America. It was sporty, attractive, well-built, and smooth-running compared to the Model T, which it replaced in the 1928 model year. Thousands of people were eager to see for themselves that "Henry's made a lady out of Lizzie," and they stormed Ford showrooms when the Model A debuted on December 2, 1927. In less than two weeks there were 400,000 orders, and Henry Ford could not keep up with the demand for his latest "gift" to an increasingly mobile nation. Despite the onset of the Depression, Model A production remained strong at 1,261,053 cars in 1930 but fell to 626,579 cars in 1931, the last year that the Model A was produced.

In the early 1920s, the plain, utilitarian Ford Model T far outsold other new cars and gave millions of working Americans the advantages of personal mobility. But by the mid-1920s, Ford's market share was shrinking because other automobile manufacturers offered stylish, sophisticated cars at low prices and enticements such as buying on credit. Henry Ford decided to replace the Model T with a new car that would attract as much attention as the "Tin Lizzie" once had. The much-anticipated 1928 Ford Model A was chic and sporty, and it had mechanical features that the Model T lacked: a three-speed, sliding-gear transmission, four-wheel brake system, and hydraulic shock absorbers. Sales were strong, but Ford never again dominated the new-car market as it had at the height of the Model T's popularity; Chevrolet, Plymouth, and other makes proved to be formidable rivals in the 1930s and beyond. In the 1932 model year, Ford replaced the Model A with a new line of cars featuring V-8 engines.


# Fashíon Fun: June Brídes



"With the June wedding season approaching, here is what a bride needs before the wedding, as suggested in McCall's, 1931. For each bed, four sheets, six pillowcases, one pair blankets, one comforter. Also, one dozen bath towels, eighteen face towels, eight guest towels, one dozen washcloths, two bath mats, one dozen dish towels, six glass towels, table cloths, tea cloths or placemats, large or medium size napkins, tea napkins, bureau covers, doilies, dusters, etc. The custom was that if the girl could afford it, she was to bring into the marriage enough of the household linens to start the running of a new house or apartment.

She could have had embroidered sheets to dozens and dozens of table napkins but the bride could also start comfortably with items from the above list."

If having all this stuff was required in the Depression years of 1931, no one would have been married back then!


