





I spent about 100 hours on this project but I really made about a dozen before I got one that truly worked. So now I really have to make one for Chris! Since it was his idea, I want to improve on this one to make it a bit smoother and have everything working nicely for him.

If this was going to be a purchased item, it would be pretty expensive. You'd have to pay me \$20/hour for my time and pay for materials (brass and aluminum). The machinery I use is also very expensive. I also used 1/16" diameter brass pins to hold it in.

Too bad I can't patent this "spinner"!





Fashíon Fun: Shoes for the Beach




Dear Model A Friends,


