

## Member's Corner: My 1929 Model A Roadster

In 2008 my daughter-in-law, Colleen, called and said "There is a beautiful car advertised on Ebay. It has a rumble seat!" That's all I needed to hear. My son, Scott Hasse and I went to check it out. A few days later I owned a 1929 Ford Roadster. Needless to say, I have no mechanical ability, but by the grace of God and friends, the car is still on the road.


My son invented and built a bike holder for the Ford as a Mother's Day gift. This definitely makes it fun to drive the bike to a bike trail!





Regarding the (29-31) two tooth steering assembly, I recently had a problem leaking a lot of oil. I have the new style rebuilt sector mounting housing with needle bearings and new seals and the internal special housing end plate with long tube A-3568-T and gasket. Bratton's catalog and others say use 4-1/2 total ounces 600W oil for two tooth assembly. Some brands of 600W oil say it is not the old 600W oil but the new 140 SAE which I can see is thinner. Snyder's catalog says their M-533 oil is like the old 600W.

I never noticed steering oil leaking with old 600W oil. All my light switches and horn work which are connected at bottom of steering. No leakage at the sector mounting housing at the frame.



Could that much oil leak out at the inboard thrust /nut adjusting screw? My theory is I have been overfilling to the top of inlet with the new thinner oil and it may be flowing out through the internal extended tube. I don't want to remove the whole steering column for solution.

Anyone have this problem? Discuss at future meeting. I can keep refilling the gear housing easier than removing the complete steering column. You know what that's like!


# Fashion Fun: Aprons!

Aprons make acceptable gifts! Aprons have been around a long time but there are lots of choices today. They appeared in Medieval and Renaissance paintings and mostly looked like they were rectangles. Today they are more of a fashion statement but just as utilitarian.

In the past, people did not have the luxury of a large worrobe nor did they have the laundry facilities as we have today, so aprons served the purpose of covering your dress to protect it from soiling. The apron could be washed every couple of day or more often, whereas the dress under the apron maybe only was washed once a week.

Aprons followed the lines of the dress during the 1920s – long and no waistline. During later years, they were sometimes cinched at the waist. Up until the 1940s, large quantities of flour and chicken feed arrived in cotton sacks and were durable enough to withstand washings and rough handling. The sacks came in bright, colorful, floral patterns. After an apron had seen it's better day, the best parts were cut out and used for quilts. No wasting in those days!



Full apron – covers the whole front half

Half apron - tied at the waist

Princess apron – full apron with bib and skirt, cut in one piece and no waist seam. This style was very popular in the 1920s and 1930s.

Pinafore – bib style that covered the chest and fastened with a pin, thus the name.

Pinny – British slang for a pinafore or apron

Hostess - 1950s term for a half apron, dainty fabric and made for show

Bib – top portion of apron that covers the chest and made from a simple square

Smock – more like a dress. Popular for painting and gardening.

Cobbler - covers front and back, generally straight with ties or buttons at the sides

Chef's – one piece with straight "skirt" and bib. Ties in the back





So when you need a gift, think of an apron. There are lots of patterns to choose from!




