Tech-Talk

Review of information gleaned from Tuesday meeting discussion about Model A vs Model B distributor cams:

Bob Bellard opened our evening discussion asking if anyone has experience with performance differences between "A" and "B" distributor cams.


Reference was made to a detailed article that appears in *The Restorer*, Nov/Dec 2011, by Steve Pargeter The Great Model "B" Distributor Cam Ouestion.


The Model "A" cam has 4 distinct lobes that control the points open and close, as in the picture shown. The lobe profile create a distinct open and close of points; Ford part number A-12210.

Where as the "B" cam lobe profile was changed to a gradual open with a distinct close; Ford part number B-12210. This change in profile allows allows the points to close earlier than the "A". This change results in additional time for the coil to saturate, therefore a hotter spark. (About 10° dwell time)

Stipe Machine of Plymouth, WI manufactures a re-designed distributor cam that emulates the 10 degree increase in dwell and is advertised to increase performance. A couple of members have installed this cam design and say their engines run better.

C Clasp A C clasp is a piece of metal, plastic or other material in the shape of the letter C. The C catches the supporting pin in order to secure the piece of jewelry in place. These types of clasps most often are found on antique brooches. Because C clasps are found most commonly on pieces of jewelry made before 1900, the presence of a C clasp is often a good indicator that the piece of jewelry is more than 100 years old and therefore a true antique. C clasps, while not common, still are used today but are made primarily out of plastic as opposed to metal.

Safety Clasp The safety clasp effectively replaced the C clasp in 1910. Also known as a rollover clasp or locking C clasp, it has a small piece of metal that rolls over the pin in order to lock the pin in place. It is sturdier and less prone to coming undone than the older C clasp. You can find safety clasps on many pieces of vintage jewelry, and they also are used today in the creation of modern jewelry.

Trombone Clasp A trombone clasp has a piece of metal on one side that slides in and out, mimicking the action of a trombone. This sliding piece secures the pin in place. Trombone clasps are much more common in Europe than in the United States. They are often a good indicator of an antique piece of jewelry, as they have been used in jewelry-making since the 1850s.



Members' Corner : Dennis Eksten's Love of a 1931 Model A

Early in 1950 I was looking to buy a car! One day, my Dad spotted a nice 1931 Model A Ford! We bought it for only \$75! In April 1950 my Dad took me on my 15th birthday to the Illinois Drivers License Examining Station in the old Army ARMORY building on North Main Street in Rockford. I then passed my IL DL! Great! I shall never forget that summer of 1950. I had a part time job earning 50 cents per hour. I would stop in at the Clark gas station on Jefferson Street just off of East State Street to buy gasoline which cost just 19 cents per gallon! Then I and a few friends would visit the Park-More root beer stand on 9th Street where Swedish American Hospital now occupies, or the root beer drive-in on the corner of Alpine and East State, now long gone too. That summer of 1950 I think we visited all the area festivals too. What fun!

One day my electric starter failed on my then 19-year-old car. No Problem! I used the hand crank to start my Ford. My Dad warned me that if the car backfired, it could break my arm but that fortunately never happened. I soon obtained another electric starter!

Another day I was driving down 9th Street by the old Rockford Standard Furniture Store (gone too!). I came up over the elevated railroad tracks, but had to stop suddenly on the other side of the little hill when a car darted out from the side street. Bang! I was rear-ended by a motorist who suddenly was not able to stop when he came up over the little hill. The rear bumper on my car was damaged. No problem! My dad had a good friend who welded it for me. With a little paint, it then looked like new! Not like the bumperless autos these days in which a rear end collision can do a thousand dollars of damage! Sadly, about a year later I sold my Model A for only \$77! (No I don't remember who bought it; that was more than 60 years ago!)

However, I have one "souvenir" of my '31 Ford. One day in that summer of 1950 I had discovered a shovel wedged in between the back of the rear seat and the frame. The previous owner probably kept it there if he had to dig himself out of a snow drift...or a mud puddle! Now every winter, like this past mild winter, I carry that ancient shovel in my car in case I need it! For all these years my love for my 1931 Ford Model A has continued. Whenever I see Model A's in parades or about town, I snap a JPG photo of them. ...And now I am a proud new member of Rock-Ford A's!

PS: My '31 Ford Model A photo was taken in the summer of 1950 by my lifelong friend, Jim Abbott, in the alley behind his boyhood home at 620 N 2nd Street in Rockford. In the photo I am standing proudly with one foot on the running board and one hand on the steering wheel. Standing behind me in the photo is a younger friend, Bill Naretta.
